Subject: Investment Update - August 2016

Economic Review: The next meeting of the Federal Reserve is scheduled for September 20th. The last meeting was held on July 26th. The Fed Funds rate was maintained at a target range of ½ to ½ percent. At the meeting, the Federal Reserve stated "the labor market strengthened and economic activity has been expanding at a moderate rate. Job gains were strong in June following weak growth in May. On balance, payrolls and other labor market indicators point to some increase in labor utilization in recent months. Household spending has been growing strongly but business fixed investment has been soft. Inflation has continued to run below the Committee's two percent longer-run objective, partly reflecting earlier declines in energy prices and in prices of non-energy imports." The latest reading of the Consumer Price Index (CPI) for Los Angeles, Riverside and Orange Counties was 1.8 for the month of July. The previous reading was 1.2 in June.

LAIF Update: LAIF ended the month of July with a yield of 0.59%. This represents a .01 basis point increase from the month of June. A comparison with last year shows a .27 basis point increase from July 2017 when the yield stood at 0.32%.

RWD Investments: Rowland Water District's bond portfolio carries an average yield of 1.16%. This represents a .01 basis point increase from the month of July and a 0.57 basis point premium to LAIF. The District had one bond purchase and mature in the month of August. A five year \$250,000 US Treasury yielding 1.50% matured on August 1st and a five year \$250,000 US Treasury yielding 1.125% was purchased. The District CD Placement program carries an effective yield of 0.93% and an average maturity of 633 days.





Water Purchases for CY 2016 (Acre-feet)





EASEMENT GRANT DEED

FOR A VALUABLE CONSIDERATION, receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, KRAUSZ PUENTE THREE, LLC, a Delaware limited liability company, ("Grantor") hereby grants to ROWLAND WATER DISTRICT, a County Water District of the State of California ("Grantee"), its successors and assigns, an easement and right of way to construct, use, maintain, operate, alter, add to, repair, replace, reconstruct, enlarge, improve, inspect, relocate (but only within the easement area) and remove, at any time and from time to time, underground water pipelines and mains (hereinafter referred to as "systems") consisting of pipes, valves, vaults, meters, air appurtenances thereto, both above ground and underground, for the purpose of transmitting, conveying and distributing water in, on, over, under, across, and along that certain real property in the County of Los Angeles, State of California, described in Exhibit "A" and shown on Exhibit "B: attached hereto and incorporated herein.

Grantor agrees that it and its successors and assigns will not erect, place or maintain, nor permit the erection, placement, or maintenance of any building, wall, sign, light standard or other structure, nor increase the earth fill above said systems to a depth of more than four (4) feet or remove the earth fill to a depth of less than three (3) feet nor plant any trees on the above described real property. The Grantee and its contractors, agents, and employees shall have the right to trim or cut tree roots which may endanger or interfere with said systems and shall have free access to said systems and every part thereof, at all times for the purpose of exercising the rights herein granted; provided however, that in making any excavation on said property, the Grantee shall make the same in such manner as will cause the least injury to the surface of the ground around such excavation, and shall replace the earth so removed by it and restore existing asphalt pavement to as near the same condition as it was prior to such excavation as is practicable.

If after the expiration of 90 days from written notice the subject property remains without use, then the rights hereby granted shall terminate. 



Our Responsibility under U.S. Generally Accepted Auditing Standards and Government Auditing Standards

As stated in our engagement letter dated August 9, 2016, our responsibility, as described by professional standards, is to express an opinion about whether the financial statements prepared by management with your oversight are fairly presented, in all material respects, in conformity with U.S. generally accepted accounting principles. Our audit of the financial statements does not relieve you or management of your responsibilities.

As part of our audit, we will consider the internal control of the District. Such considerations are solely for the purpose of determining our audit procedures and not to provide any assurance concerning such internal control.

As part of obtaining reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements are free of material misstatement, we will also perform tests of the District's compliance with certain provisions of laws, regulations, contracts, and grants. However, providing an opinion on compliance with those provisions is not an objective of our audit.

We are responsible for communicating significant matters related to the audit that are, in our professional judgment, relevant to your responsibilities in overseeing the financial reporting process. However, we are not required to design procedures specifically to identify such matters.

Generally accepted accounting principles provide for certain required supplementary information (RSI) to supplement the basic financial statements. 





Re: Training and Risk Assessment Visit

Dear Tom:

Thank you for your personal welcome during my visit to Rowland Water District on August 18, 2016. The purpose was to conduct training, review loss history, and obtain an update on operations. Please extend my thanks to Eric Hall, Senior Water Systems Operator, for scheduling the training my visit and his time during my visit.

Traffic Control and Flagger was provided for your staff and several other ACWA JPIA member agencies. The training focused on the requirements found in the California Manual of Uniform Traffic Control Devices adopted as of November 2014. Those attending reviewed the importance of:

- Using traffic control templates
- Work zone signage and spacing requirements
- Flagger responsibilities and proper hand signals
- Providing safe and reliable direction through all work zones

The material was presented in an interactive format that developed team building and resource sharing. Each attendee was provided with a copy of the 2016 WATCH Book, to be used as a reference when setting up temporary traffic control. Thank you for opening up your boardroom to host this class.

We reviewed the District's loss history. The Experience Modification Rates (E-Mod) in the Workers' Compensation (WC) and Liability Programs are currently better than average (less than 1.0) in both Programs. As a result, the District is receiving premium discounts in excess of \$15,000. In the Property Program there has not been a major loss in the last three policy years. There is no E-Mod associated with the Property Program. Please thank your staff for their continuing efforts in risk management and loss reduction.

Your staff also oversees the financial operations related to the Pomona-Walnut-Rowland Joint Waterline Commission. Walnut Valley Water District continues to be responsible for the inspection and maintenance of the Commission. There was only one reported Liability loss related to these operations since the Commission joined the Program in the 1986/87 policy year. The Commission does not have exposures, and therefore, does not participate in our Property or Workers' Compensation Programs.

Thank you for your continuing support of the "Commitment to Excellence" (C2E) Program. Eric highlighted a number of best practices and C2E actions that are being implemented to reduce exposures. These include:

- Adding backup cameras on large fleet vehicles (> 1.5 tons) to increase visibility and reduce backing incidents. (Vehicle Best Practices)
- Installing lightweight manhole lids to reduce the possibility of ergonomic injuries (lifting/back injuries). (Ergonomic Best Practices)
- Upgrading security systems at the main office that includes the addition of panic buttons, automatic door locks, and emergency strobes. (Infrastructure Best Practices)

Please pass on my compliments to your staff for their ongoing C2E efforts to reduce the number of incidents and value of claims.

Changes that have occurred in personnel at the JPIA were discussed. These are related to the retirements of Dick Damon and Diane Salvador. We have two new claims managers: Jennifer Nogosek, Liability and Property Claims Manager; and Melody Tucker, Workers' Compensation Claims Manager. Karen Thesing has also joined us as our Director of Insurance Services. Please feel free to reach out and have your staff introduce themselves.

Cyber Liability Coverage will be added to all Liability Program members at no extra charge for the 2016/17 program year. The Cyber Coverage will protect the members from a variety of cyber exposures. The coverage limit is \$2 million per occurrence, and there is a range of deductibles. Be on the lookout for additional details on this coverage in the near future.

As a reminder, the JPIA wants to be notified of any potential claim. This is especially true in the event of a work related injury, or property/liability damage due to a line break or flooding. Remember that we have two hotlines: Employment Practices and Risk Transfer. Flyers are enclosed for your reference.
